WELCOME TO THE 2016 SEPTEMBER YEARLING SALE

Sale graduates sweep Triple Crown, excel internationally

Keeneland has cataloged 4,479 yearlings for the 73rd annual Keeneland September Yearling Sale, the world's largest Thoroughbred auction, to be held Sept. 12-25.

Keeneland is the world's leading Thoroughbred auction house, selling more champions and stakes winners than any other sales companies. The September Sale sets the gold standard for the industry globally, producing more graded stakes wins around the world in 2016 – 141, including 38 Grade/Group 1 wins as of Sept. 6 – more than all other North American sales companies combined.

This year, September Sale graduates swept all three Triple Crown classics: **Nyquist** won the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), **Exaggerator** took the Preakness (G1) and **Creator** upset the Belmont (G1). Exaggerator also won the Haskell Invitational (G1) and another September Sale graduate, **Arrogate**, won the Travers (G1).

Alumni are led by a contingent of accomplished fillies and mares in North America, including multiple champion **Beholder** (winner of the Vanity Mile-G1) and additional Grade 1 winners **Carina Mia** (Acorn), **Celestine** (Just a Game), **Catch a Glimpse** (Belmont Oaks Invitational), **Harmonize** (Del Mar Oaks), **Illuminant** (Gamely), **I'm a Chatterbox** (Delaware Handicap), **Off the Tracks** (Mother Goose), **Paola Queen** (Test) and **Taris** (Humana Distaff). They also highlight

the top of the handicap division with **Divisidero** (Woodford Reserve Turf Classic-G1), **Lord Nelson** (Triple Bend-G1 and Bing Crosby-G1), **Melatonin** (Santa Anita Handicap-G1 and Gold Cup at Santa Anita-G1) and **Midnight Storm** (Shoemaker Mile-G1).

September Sale graduates continue to perform exceptionally well internationally, accounting for three winners during the prestigious Royal Ascot meet: **Order of St George (IRE)**, who captured the Gold Cup in Honour of the Queen's 90th Birthday (G1); **Lady Aurelia**, winner of the Queen Mary (G2), and **Hawkbill**, winner of the Tercentenary (G3). Hawkbill later won the Coral-Eclipse (G1) at Sandown; **Boynton** took the Superlative (G2); **Roly Poly** won the Duchess of Cambridge (G2), both at Newmarket, and Lady Aurelia won the Darley Prix Morny (G1) at Deauville.

Through Labor Day, the 2015 September Sale had produced these graded stakes-winning juveniles: **Bitumen**, **Boynton**, **Champagne Room**, **Classic Empire**, **Gunnevera**, Lady Aurelia, **Levante Lion**, **Made You Look**, **Nonna Mela**, **Practical Joke**, **Pretty City Dancer**, Roly Poly and **Union Strike**.

PREMIER THREE-DAY BOOK 1 CATALOG OPENS 2016 SALE

For the second consecutive year, the sale's first three sessions comprise the premier Book 1 catalog. The format for the entire sale, which covers 13 sessions, is as follows:

Book 1 (Monday-Wednesday, Sept. 12-14) – All sessions begin at 11 a.m. ET.

Dark Day (Thursday, Sept. 15) – No sale will be held.

Book 2 (Friday-Saturday, Sept. 16-17) – Sessions begin at 10 a.m.

Books 3-6 (Sunday-Sunday, Sept. 18-25) – Sessions begin at 10 a.m.

Of the 4,479 yearlings cataloged to the 2016 September Sale, 2,334 colts and 2,145 are fillies.

BRISK TRADE MARKS 2015 SEPTEMBER SALE

The 2015 September Sale generated two weeks of robust trade at all levels of the market that resulted in solid gains, including a record-equaling median price. Results reflected a continued trend toward stability in the Thoroughbred market.

It was the second consecutive September Sale during which Keeneland sold the highest-priced yearling offered at public auction in North America. The 2015 sale-topper is a colt (now named Tapit High) by leading North American sire Tapit purchased for \$2.1 million by Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm LLC. He was one of 11 yearlings that commanded \$1 million or more during the auction. Those horses sold to 10 different entities.

He returned to Fasig-Tipton as Vice President of Fasig-Tipton Appraisals and Director of Sales Administration prior to joining Keeneland in 1996 as Assistant Director of Sales to Rogers Beasley.

Russell represents Keeneland on the Sales Integrity Task Force, International Catalogue Standards Committee (NA) (ICSC), International Grading and Race Planning Advisory Committee (IRPAC), and is Vice Chairman of the Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers (SITA). He is also on the board of the Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation.

Thomas J. Thornbury | Associate Director of Sales Operations



Tom Thornbury was named Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales in June 2002.

In his position, Thornbury acts as liaison to consignor interests, cultivates relationships with horsemen in emerging racing markets, and serves as a member of the yearling inspection team.

Thornbury grew up on the farm owned by his father, John Thornbury, and partner Dr. Robert Copelan, where he was involved in training and farm management, and assisted in equine orthopedic surgery. Thornbury spent nearly 10 years at Airdrie Stud, owned by former Governor and Mrs. Brereton C. Jones, working first as yearling manager and later as general manager.

He is a past president of the Thoroughbred Club of America and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers' Club, and formerly served on the board of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association and Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders.

Born in Montana and raised in Phoenix, Ullery has a family heavily involved in racing. He was introduced to the sport by his grandfather Burton Farley, a trainer in the Northwest and at Turf Paradise, and by his aunt Coralee Farley, a longtime racing official. His mother, LeAnn Hickman, works for Coady Photography.

Ullery's first involvement in equine auctions came while working in the summers at a monthly sale in Montana managed by his father, Keith Ullery. He later gained experience at Thoroughbred sales conducted by the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, Heritage Place and the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company.

The PA announcer for his high school sports teams, Ullery at 19 became the track announcer at Fair Meadows in Tulsa in 2007. He was named to the same post at Will Rogers and Blue Ribbon Downs in Oklahoma the following year.

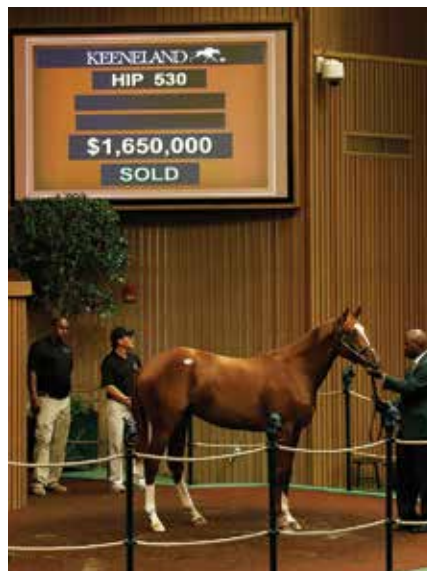

The Keeneland September Yearling Sale has evolved from humble beginnings to become the global marketplace for Thoroughbred yearlings.

From 1944, the inaugural year, through 1948, the fall yearlings were sold in an auction which included broodmares, weanlings, stallions and horses of other ages. In 1949, approximately half of the yearlings were sold in a separate October sale and the remainder in a November mixed stock sale as usual. In 1950, the yearlings were sold separately by session, but in the same week as the other stock. In 1951, the fall yearling sales were set farther apart from the fall mixed stock sale, with the yearling auctions preceding the other sale by a week or more. In 1960, the yearling sales were moved to September. In 1981, the yearling sale was held in two four-day segments. Selected sessions were inaugurated in 1989.

Background: Craig Bendoroff was a jockey in New Jersey in the early 1970s until a spill at Garden State Park in 1974 left him without the use of his right arm, forcing him to explore other career paths within the industry. He and wife Holly each gained experience working in various bloodstock and sales capacities, and in 1990 they opened Denali Stud. "Denali" is derived from the name given by the Eskimos to Mt. McKinley and means "the great one." Today, Denali covers 700 acres.

In the late 1990s, Bob Lewis and his wife, Beverly, sent champion Serena's Song to Denali after she was retired. Denali has sold several of Serena Song's offspring, including Group 1 winner Sophisticat, by Storm Cat, for \$3.4 million at Keeneland's 2000 July Selected Yearling Sale; Grade 2 winner Harlington, by Unbridled, for \$2.8 million at the 2003 September Sale; and Colourful Score, a colt by Storm Cat, for \$3.5 million at the 2005 September Sale.

Denali consigned to the September Sale two future Kentucky Derby (G1) winners: Real Quiet, who won the Derby and Preakness (G1) in 1998, and Animal Kingdom, winner of the 2011 Derby. Another of Denali's September Sale graduates is champion Left Bank. In 2015, Denali was represented by Grade 1 winners Curalina and Her Emmynency.

The Bendoroffs' son, Conrad, is among the 12 people from seven countries selected for the 2015-2017 class of the Darley Flying Start program.

At last year's September Sale, Denali sold 76 yearlings for \$10,481,400. Its high seller was the War Front colt out of Grade 2 winner Satans Quick Chick that sold for \$900,000 to Hideyuki Mori.

Eaton's September Sale graduates include 2007-2008 Horse of the Year Curlin, champion English Channel and Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner Summerly.

At last year's September Sale, Eaton sold 97 yearlings for \$11,447,600. At \$900,000, its high seller was the War Front colt out of Magnificent Honour, a full sister to champion Rags to Riches sold to M.V. Magnier.

Other Keeneland sales highlights for Eaton came in 2004 when it purchased four-time Keeneland graded stakes winner Take Charge Lady, who was in foal to Seeking the Gold, for \$4.2 million at Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale. From Take Charge Lady, Eaton bred Grade 1 winner Take Charge Indy, a colt by A.P. Indy, and 2013 champion 3-year-old male Will Take Charge, a colt by Unbridled's Song.

Eaton Sales served as agent for the dispersal of the W.T. Young family's Overbrook Farm, which in 2009-2010 sold 205 horses for \$38,606,000.

Background: At the 2015 September Sale, Gainesway sold the first-, second- and fourth-highest-priced horses. The sale-topper was the \$2.1 million son of Gainesway stallion Tapit whose second dam is Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Winning Colors. He was purchased by Whisper Hill Farm LLC.

Selling for \$1.65 million was the Tapit colt out of Grade 1 winner Pure Clan who was purchased by Lael Stable. The Bernardini filly, a full sister to Grade 1 winners To Honor and Serve and Angela Renee, sold to Justin Zayat for \$1.5 million.

For the entire sale, Gainesway sold 119 yearlings for \$23,489,900, including three horses for \$1 million and more. Those yearlings averaged \$197,394, placing Gainesway among the leading consignors by average price.

Located on Paris Pike just outside Lexington, Gainesway is a 1,500-acre, full-service Thoroughbred farm that stands nine stallions. The farm was founded by John R. Gaines, who was famous for his innovations in the Thoroughbred industry, including the concept that became the Breeders' Cup World Championships (held at Keeneland for the first time in 2015). In 1989, Graham J. Beck, a successful businessman, wine maker and Thoroughbred horseman in his native South Africa, purchased the farm from Gaines.

Beck died in July 2010. Today, his son, Antony, oversees farm operations as President. The younger Beck's involvement in the Thoroughbred industry includes being a Keeneland Director and serving on the board of directors of Breeders' Cup Ltd.

Gainesway includes two historic operations, Greentree Stud and the C.V. Whitney farm. Beck and his wife, Angela, have nurtured Gainesway into a facility known for more than Thoroughbreds. An emphasis on trees and spectacular gardens helped the farm earn official status as an arboretum from the American Public Garden Association.

Background: Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency is the sales arm of John G. Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm near Lexington. A Keeneland Director, Sikura has a lifelong involvement in the Thoroughbred industry.

Sikura was mentored by his father, John Sikura, Jr., a Canadian entrepreneur and founder of Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Ontario. The younger Sikura grew up attending the sales and races with his father, and he learned the business while working at Hill 'n' Dale's Kentucky division in the 1980s.

Following the death of his father in 1994, Sikura began to build the Kentucky farm into a prominent breeding and sales operation. Hill 'n' Dale encompasses 1,300 acres and stands 13 stallions, including Curlin, Midnight Lute and Stormy Atlantic. The farm is the final resting place of 1977 Triple Crown winner and leading sire Seattle Slew.

Among the horses Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency has consigned to the September Sale are champions Maryfield and Will Take Charge. The operation also is prominent at other Keeneland sales. At the 2007 November Breeding Stock Sale, it sold, as agent for Swettenham Stud, the highest-priced horse in that sale's history – Playful Act (IRE) – for \$10.5 million. The amount is the third-highest price ever paid for a horse at a Keeneland sale.

At the 2015 September Sale, Hill 'n' Dale sold 76 yearlings for \$9,842,000. Among them were two fillies – by Fastnet Rock (AUS) and War Front – that brought \$1 million each. Spendthrift Farm bought the former, and Mayberry Farm purchased the latter.

Background: Lane's End owner William S. Farish manages the 3,300-acre Central Kentucky operation with his son, Bill. Lane's End is home to 15 stallions, including Candy Ride (ARG), Lemon Drop Kid and Mineshaft. The farm has welcomed such guests as President George H.W. Bush, his son, President George W. Bush, and Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

A lifelong horseman, the elder Farish bought his first Thoroughbred at the 1963 September Sale. Since then, he has campaigned more than 165 stakes winners and bred more than 300 stakes winners, including Horses of the Year Mineshaft (2003) and A.P. Indy (1992). Farish received the Eclipse Award as leading breeder in 1992 and 1999. He has served on Keeneland's Board of Directors since 1985. In October 2006, he succeeded James E. (Ted) Bassett III as a Keeneland Trustee.

Bill Farish's involvement in the industry includes serving as Chairman of the Board of Breeders' Cup Ltd., and he is a Keeneland Director. He

also races horses and in 2005 founded Woodford Racing LLC, a partnership that includes friends and others he has introduced to Thoroughbred racing.

Lane's End handled the highest-grossing Thoroughbred dispersal in North American history as agent for the Edward P. Evans Spring Hill Farm Dispersal at Keeneland. The dispersal sold 221 horses for \$62,364,000 in 2011-2012.

Lane's End also was agent for the Complete Dispersal of Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments N.V., Inc. in 2011. The dispersal sold 40 horses for \$17,926,500 at Keeneland's September and November sales.

Among the horses Lane's End has consigned to the September Sale are champions Lemon Drop Kid, Rags to Riches, Stevie Wonderboy and Wait a While; Belmont (G1) winners Bet Twice, Jazil and Palace Malice; Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) winner Court Vision; and Epsom Derby (G1) winner Kris Kin.

In 2014, Lane's End became the sponsor of Keeneland's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1). The \$500,000 invitational turf stakes for 3-year-old fillies will be run for the 33rd time on Oct. 15.

At last year's September Sale, Lane's End sold 179 yearlings for \$25,156,900. Its highest-priced offering was the colt by Medaglia d'Oro-Kid Kate, by Lemon Drop Kid, that sold for \$1.1 million.

Costello moved to Central Kentucky in the early 1980s, first developing and managing Crescent Hill Farm. From there he opened his own Drumkenny Farm, a full-service boarding operation that caters to clients such as Sam-Son Farm of Canada.

Duignan came to the U.S. in the mid-1980s, first working for Circle O Farm and later managing Ironwood Farm in Western Kentucky. In 2001, he was named President of Castleton-Lyons near Lexington. Two years later, Duignan started his own full-service operation, Foxtale Farm.

Costello and Duignan first became partners when they created a successful pinhooking operation called "The Lads."

Duignan bred multiple Grade 1 winner Brody's Cause in partnership with William Arvin Jr. and Petaluma Bloodstock. Paramount Sales, agent, sold the Giant's Causeway colt to Albaugh Family Stable for \$350,000 at the 2014 September Sale.

At the 2015 September Sale, Paramount sold 84 yearlings for \$7,804,700. At \$600,000, the high seller was the filly by Medaglia d'Oro-Meerkat Miss, by Giant's Causeway, purchased by Mayberry Farm.

Taylor, the eldest son of noted horseman Joe Taylor who was 19 years old at the time. Joe Taylor, an acknowledged authority on Thoroughbred breeding, developed John Gaines' Gainesway Farm into a leading stallion farm during his 40-year management.

Taylor Made quickly evolved into a full-service breeding and sales facility with five stallions on the farm's Kentucky roster. Joining Duncan, a Keeneland Director who is Taylor Made's president and CEO in its operation are his brothers Ben (stallions), Frank (boarding) and Mark (marketing and public sales). Pat Payne (vice president of sales) also is a partner.

Represented by its first Keeneland consignment in 1978, Taylor Made, according to its website, has sold more than \$1.6 billion in Thoroughbreds. Future champions sold at the September Sale are Anees, Farda Amiga and Ashado. Sold as a yearling for \$170,000, Ashado brought \$9 million, a Keeneland record for a broodmare prospect, when Taylor Made consigned her to the 2005 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The amount is the seventh-highest price ever paid for a horse at any Keeneland sale.

Among the horses Taylor Made has consigned to the September Sale are Belmont (G1) and Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Drosselmeyer; Preakness (G1) winner and champion Lookin At Lucky; Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner Lemons Forever and Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) winner Cajun Beat.

Warrendale was founded by lifelong horsewoman Kitty Taylor, who grew up in a military family and graduated with a degree in equestrian science from William Woods College in Missouri. Following her graduation, she began breaking and galloping Thoroughbreds in Virginia. During the summers, she also worked the yearling sales in Kentucky and New York, gaining hands-on experience with top consignor Lee Eaton.

In 1992, Taylor became director of sales for noted Central Kentucky horseman Ben Walden at Vinery. She managed the Vinery consignments for eight years.

Taylor partnered with Meg Levy to open Bluewater Sales before establishing Warrendale in 2002. She named the operation for the street on which she lived in Georgetown, Ky. Among the horses Warrendale has sold is champion She's a Tiger.

Simms, a native of Lexington, became interested in the Thoroughbred business at a young age while attending Keeneland on a regular basis. During college, he worked as a yearling foreman at Stone Farm in Paris, Ky. After graduating from the University of Mississippi with a bachelor's degree in marketing, Simms worked as Stone Farm's yearling manager for four years before joining Warrendale, where he also serves as Director of Bloodstock Services.

At the 2015 September Sale, Warrendale sold 74 yearlings for \$8,209,000. Sold as agent for Stonestreet Bred & Raised, its high seller was the colt by Speightstown-Wild Gams, by Forest Wildcat, who sold for \$610,000 to Steven W. Young, agent.

Background:

At the 2013 September Sale, Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm sold the \$2.5 million sale topper, a War Front colt purchased by M.V. Magnier of Coolmore Stud. The colt, named Treaty of Rome, is out of the stakes-placed During mare Blading Gold Ring.

The \$2.5-million sale represented a major pinhooking score for Woods Edge. O'Callaghan, signing the ticket as Brittlynn Stables, purchased the colt as a weanling for \$180,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

Born in Ireland, O'Callaghan is the son of noted horseman Gay O'Callaghan. Peter handled 2-year-olds in the yard of trainer Aidan O'Brien then moved to the U.S. to work for prominent juvenile consignor Nick de Meric. After working for Dromoland Farm, he founded Woods Edge in 2001. Woods Edge' consigned its first horses to the September Sale in 2002.

Among the horses Woods Edge has consigned to the September Sale is Grade 1 winner Eskendereya.

At the 2015 September Sale, Woods Edge sold 40 yearlings for \$5,818,000. Its high seller was the colt by Candy Ride (ARG)-Androeah, by Arch, purchased by John Ferguson for \$380,000.

Prominent September Sale Buyers

Calumet Farm

Background: In 2015, Calumet Farm bought 17 yearlings for \$3.02 million at the September Sale. At \$350,000, the highest-priced member of the group was the Bernardini colt out of Grade 1 winner Dream Rush who is a half-brother to Grade 1 winner Dreaming of Julia and stakes winner Atriedes. He was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Stonestreet Bred & Raised.

Since 2012, successful businessman Brad Kelley has overseen Calumet, one of the most famous horse farms in North America and Keeneland's neighbor. In May 2013, Nicole Russo of *Daily Racing Form* described Calumet's notable history:

"Calumet has lived through a number of transformations, morphing from a Standardbred facility into an elite Thoroughbred nursery as it passed through the Wright family, campaigning two homebred Triple Crown winners, and, decades later, surviving an episode of bankruptcy. Today, the farm is in the hands of Kelley, a deeply private billionaire with a passion for racing."

Among Kelley's racing success under the Calumet banner is winning the 2013 Preakness (G1) with Oxbow, who now stands at Calumet. In 2011, Eddie Kane, agent for Kelley's Bluegrass Hall LLC, paid \$250,000 for the son of Awesome Again at Keeneland's September Sale.

Racing in the name of Kelley's Bluegrass Hall LLC, Hightail won the 2012 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint. Hightail is a graduate of the 2011 September Sale. D. Wayne Lukas trained Hightail and Oxbow.

With Kelley at the helm, Calumet scored its first win at Keeneland during the 2014 Spring Meet. In 2016, Calumet stood 14 stallions in Kentucky and three other stallions in Arkansas, Indiana and Ohio.

Calumet has been extremely active at other re-

cent Keeneland sales. In 2015, the farm bought 18 horses for \$790,500 at the January Horses of All Ages Sale and 71 horses for \$8,717,000 at the November Breeding Stock Sale. Calumet bought more horses than any other buyer at the November Sale.

At the 2016 January Sale, Calumet acquired nine horses for \$819,000 to be the auction's third-leading buyer by gross.

Background: John Magnier is managing partner of Coolmore Stud, which has headquarters in Fethard, County Tipperary, Ireland, and farms in Kentucky at Ashford Stud near Versailles and in Australia in the Hunter Valley in New South Wales. Magnier's son M.V. Magnier has represented Coolmore at recent Keeneland sales.

At the 2014 September Sale, M.V. Magnier paid \$490,000 for future European champion Air Force Blue. Breeder Stone Farm sold the son of War Front who won three Group 1 races in England and Ireland.

At the 2015 September Sale, M.V. Magnier purchased six yearlings — all colts — for a grand total of \$3,525,000. Three are by War Front, two are by Scat Daddy and one is by Uncle Mo. At \$1.15 million, the highest-priced purchase was the War Front colt out of Orate, a half-sister to leading sire Pulpit. Claiborne Farm, agent, consigned the half-brother to stakes winner Endless Chatter.

John Magnier helped establish Coolmore as one of the world's leading stallion operations. In 1975, legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien tapped him to manage Coolmore for O'Brien and partner Robert Sangster. Their association resulted in Coolmore's domination of the European clas-

sics during the late 1970s and 1980s often with horses purchased at Keeneland sales.

Magnier principally campaigns horses in the colors of his wife, Susan, daughter of Vincent O'Brien. Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith also are Coolmore business associates. Tabor earned Keeneland's gold tray during the 2008 Fall Meet in recognition of his eighth graded stakes win at the track. Either individually or in various partnerships, the Magniers, Tabor and Smith have been represented by numerous Group or Grade 1 winners and champions in Europe and the U.S.

In 2005, Demi O'Byrne purchased future champion Rags to Riches on behalf of Tabor and Smith for \$1.9 million at the September Sale. Rags to Riches won the 2007 Kentucky Oaks (G1) and became only the third filly in history to win the Belmont (G1). She is a member of the Racing Hall of Fame.

Coolmore Ireland stands such leading stallions as Galileo (IRE) and Danehill Dancer, while American Pharoah, Giant's Causeway, Lookin At Lucky, Tale of the Cat and Uncle Mo are among the stallions at Ashford. American Pharoah, winner of the Triple Crown in 2015, entered stud at Ashford this year.

Coolmore also encompasses the famed Ballydoyle training yard, where O'Brien conditioned such champions as Sir Ivor, Nijinsky II, Alleged, Storm Bird and Sadler's Wells. Today it is the base for Irish champion trainer Aidan O'Brien (no relation).

2016 stakes winners (as of Sept. 6) purchased at the September Sale: Grade 2 winner Cupid.

Courtlandt Farm

Background: Successful businessman Donald A. Adam races horses in the name of Courtlandt Farm and owns a 370-acre farm by that name in Ocala, Fla. Adam became involved in racing in 1995 after meeting William S. Farish, owner of Lane's End and a prominent owner, breeder and industry leader.

Courtlandt has won four stakes at Keeneland, including the 2003 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1) with Film Maker and the 2009 Doubledogdare (G3) with homebred Indescribable. Film Maker, bred by Adam in the name of TAC Holdings, won eight races, ran second or third in three consecutive runnings of the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1) and earned more than \$2.2 million

Other notable Courtlandt homebreds include 2016 Woodford Reserve Ballston Spa (G2) winner Strike Charmer; multiple graded stakes winner Adriano, who competed in the 2008 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1); and Grade 3 winner Machen.

At Keeneland's 2005 November Breeding Stock Sale, Courtlandt paid \$1.15 million for Sweet Talker, who the previous month won the QE II at Keeneland. For Courtlandt, the daughter of Stormin Fever won the Dahlia Stakes at Laurel and the WinStar Distaff (G3) at Lone Star in consecutive starts.

Courtlandt purchased six yearlings for \$2,945,000 at the 2015 September Sale. At \$725,000, its most expensive purchase was the Distorted Humor filly from the family of Grade 1 winner Secret Status. She was consigned by Gainesway, agent for Mt. Brilliant Farm.

Crupi's New Castle

Background: A former leading trainer in New Jersey during his 30-year career, James "J.J." Crupi is a consignor and bloodstock adviser for a number of prominent owners.

In 1995, he founded Crupi's New Castle Farm in Ocala, Fla., on the site of the Wolfson family's Happy Valley Farm. New Castle, which covers more than 200 acres, includes a six-furlong training track over which the Wolfsons' Triple Crown winner Affirmed trained.

Among the horses Crupi has been associated with is 2015 Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) winner Liam's Map. In fact, he led the colt into Keeneland's Winner's Circle after the race. At the 2012 September Sale, Liam's Map sold to

Crupi, agent for St. Elias Stables, for \$800,000. A few races after the Dirt Mile, Stopchargingmaria, who also had trained at Crupi's farm, won the Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1).

Crupi's New Castle was the second-leading buyer at the 2015 September Sale, spending \$7,190,000 on 25 horses. At \$850,000, the top-priced purchase was the Bodemeister filly who is a half-sister to Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Mine That Bird and multiple Grade 1 winner Dullahan.

As agent for Repole Stable, Crupi purchased another 12 horses at the sale for \$1,895,000.

Background: John Ferguson is the principal buyer for Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, the Ruler of Dubai and Vice President and Prime Minister of the United Arab Emirates. He was the September Sale's leading buyer from 1999-2006 and in 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2015.

Last year, Ferguson bought 24 yearlings (19 colts and five fillies) for \$8,235,000 with prices ranging from \$120,000 to \$900,000. The most expensive purchase was the son of War Front out of Grade 2 winner Bauble Queen consigned by Claiborne Farm, agent.

Ferguson also is chief executive and racing manager of Godolphin, which since the beginning of the year has represented all the racing interests of Sheikh Mohammed and various members of

his family, and has racehorses in England, Ireland, France, the U.S., Australia and Japan.

Sheikh Mohammed's Darley is headquartered at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, England, and stands stallions around the world. In Kentucky, Darley's operation is based at Darley at Jonabell, the former Jonabell Farm acquired from the family of founder John A. Bell in 2001. The 13 stallions there include Kentucky Derby (G1) winners Animal Kingdom and Street Sense and leading sires Bernardini, Hard Spun and Medaglia d'Oro.

Kentucky Derby (G1) winner and champion 2-year-old male Nyquist is to enter stud at Darley following his racing career.

On opening day of Keeneland's Fall Meet, Darley sponsors the \$400,000 Darley Alcibiades (G1) for 2-year-old fillies. The Oct. 7 race, which kicks off Fall Stars Weekend, is a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" race, awarding the winner a berth to the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) on Nov. 1 at Santa Anita.

For Sheikh Mohammed, Ferguson has purchased the four highest-priced horses at the September Sale. They are led by Meydan City, the \$11.7 million son of Kingmambo purchased in 2006. The colt is the second-most expensive horse sold at Keeneland behind \$13.1 million spent on Seattle Dancer at the 1985 July Selected Yearling Sale.

On Sept. 10 at the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's National Awards Dinner at Stonestreet Farm in Lexington, Godolphin was honored as Kentucky's breeder of the year.

Shadwell Estate Co. Ltd.

Background: Shadwell Estate Co. Ltd., which represents Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum, was the leading buyer by gross at the September Sale in 1992, 1994, 2010, 2012 and 2013.

Last year, Shadwell purchased nine yearlings for

\$4,755,000. At \$1.45 million, Shadwell's most expensive purchase was the War Front filly consigned by Timber Town, agent. She is out of the Galileo (IRE) mare Betterbetterbetter (IRE) and is from a family of successful European runners.

Another Shadwell purchase at the September Sale is multiple Grade 2 winner Mohaymen, who was fourth in this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). In 2014, Mohaymen was the sale's co-high seller at \$2.2 million.

Sheikh Hamdan is the Deputy Ruler and Minister of Finance and Industry in Dubai and is the older brother of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum. Like his brother, Sheikh Hamdan has had great success breeding and racing Thoroughbreds with numerous European classic winners. In 2007, Shadwell's homebred Lahudood (GB) captured the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1) and was voted champion turf female.

Shadwell encompasses six farms, including Nunnery Stud and Beech House Stud in England and Shadwell Farm near Keeneland. Rick Nichols serves as Vice President/General Manager of Shadwell's Kentucky operation, which Sheikh Hamdan founded in 1985.

The Kentucky farm, which covers some 1,300 acres, stands three stallions, including 2006 Horse of the Year Invador (ARG). In 2006, Sheikh Hamdan celebrated his first American classic victory when Jazil won the Belmont (G1). Shadwell purchased Jazil for \$725,000 at the 2004 September Sale. The colt's half-sister is Racing Hall of Famer and champion Rags to Riches, another September Sale purchase who won the 2007 Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Belmont.

During the summer of 2014, Keeneland and Shadwell announced the purse of the Shadwell Turf Mile (G1) would be raised to \$1 million, marking the first seven-figure race in Keeneland history. The race, which will be run Oct. 8 during Fall Stars Weekend, awards the winner an automatic berth to the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Mile (G1).

Background: California residents Gary and Mary West, formerly of Omaha, Neb., are successful entrepreneurs and philanthropists who have enjoyed great success in Thoroughbred racing. In April 2014, they were at Keeneland to watch their homebred Room Service win the Central Bank Ashland (G1) in a dead-heat with Rosalind.

Since 1980, when they claimed a horse named Joe Blow for \$13,500, the Wests have campaigned a number of stakes winners, many of which are September Sale graduates. Among their top September Sale acquisitions, purchased in the name of their racing manager and bloodstock agent, Ben Glass, is 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner New Year's Day. Glass, whose association with the Wests began when they met in Nebraska, purchased the son of Street Cry (IRE) for \$425,000 at the 2012 September Sale.

In 2013, New Year's Day helped the Wests record their most successful season when their horses earned more than \$4.5 million to rank them third among North America's leading owners of 2013. The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association in 2014 honored the couple as its Western Region Owner of the Year.

Among the other stakes winners the Wests have purchased at the September Sale are Grade 1 winner Power Broker; Grade 2 winners Casino

Host and Family Tree; and Grade 3 winners Code West, Corporate Jungle, Market Rally, Pacific Ocean and Upgrade. This year, Family Tree won the Indiana Oaks (G2) and Iowa Oaks (G3).

Gary West began his career in hospital administration and built one of the largest telecommunications companies in the world. In 2006, the Wests formed the Gary and Mary West Foundation to pursue their philanthropic interests. Their West Health is an independent initiative whose mission is to lower healthcare costs and consists of four entities: West Health Institute, West Health Policy Center, West Health Investment Fund and West Health Incubator.

2016 stakes winners (as of Sept. 6) purchased at the September Sale: Grade 2 winner Family Tree; Grade/Group 3 winners American Freedom, Market Rally; stakes winner Code West.

Whisper Hill Farm LLC

Background: Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm LLC was the sixth-leading buyer at the 2015 September Sale. Whisper Hill acquired three yearlings for \$3.55 million. Among them was the \$2.1 million sale-topper, the Tapit colt out of Silver Colors, a daughter of Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Winning Colors consigned by Gainesway, agent.

Whisper Hill also spent \$1.05 million on the daughter of Street Cry (IRE) consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent. The filly is a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Paynter and is out of a full sister to Horse of the Year Tiznow.

Pope, who grew up riding hunters and jumpers, became interested in racing when she moved to Florida in 1980. She boards her broodmares in Kentucky and raises her young horses at Whisper Hill, which also is home to many retired Thoroughbreds.

Pope is co-owner of discount retailer Variety Wholesalers along with her brother Art. She also serves as vice chairman of the John William Pope Foundation, which works to improve

the well-being of the citizens of North Carolina and the nation through the advancement of individual freedom and personal responsibility. The foundation, named for Pope's late father, makes grants to support public policy groups, educational institutions, humanitarian efforts, and the arts.

At other recent Keeneland sales, Pope has made several high-priced acquisitions. At the 2015 November Breeding Stock Sale, Whisper Hill purchased a War Front weanling filly for a North American record \$3.2 million. The filly is out of major winner Take Charge Lady, second dam of champion Take Charge Brandi.

Zayat Stables

Background: Zayat Stables reached the pinnacle of the sports world in 2015 when its home-bred American Pharoah won the Triple Crown

and became the first horse since 1978 to capture Thoroughbred racing's most famous prize. The Pioneer of the Nile colt closed his career by winning the \$5 million Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) at Keeneland and was named Horse of the Year. He entered stud this year at Coolmore's Ashford Stud near Versailles, Ky.

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association on Sept. 10 at its National Awards Dinner at Stonestreet Farm in Lexington recognized Zayat Stables as the Southern region's owner of the year. American Pharoah's dam, Littleprincessemama, was named National Broodmare of the Year.

Ahmed Zayat, who was born in Egypt, was 18

when he moved to the U.S. He earned a master's degree in public health at Boston University and went on to found Egypt's Al Ahram Beverage Company, which creates and produces a popular nonalcoholic drink. After turning the company into the largest beverage manufacturer and distributor in the Middle East, Zayat sold the company to Heineken International. Zayat also is the largest shareholder in Misr Glass Manufacturing, the biggest manufacturer of glass containers in Egypt.

Zayat entered Thoroughbred racing in 2005. He raced two Grade 1 winners within the first year of forming Zayat Stables, and today his entire family shares his involvement in the sport. Son Justin is their racing and stallion manager.

At the 2015 September Sale, Zayat Stables singly and in partnership acquired 12 yearlings for \$3,415,000. The highest-priced purchase, at \$600,000, was the colt by The Factor out of the Bernardini mare Aspen Light, a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Great Hunter.
