About the Keeneland Association

Located in the heart of Central Kentucky and surrounded by acres of Kentucky Bluegrass, Keeneland is a worldwide attraction that plays an important role in Thoroughbred breeding and racing.

The Keeneland Association was founded in the early 1930s by a group of prominent Central Kentucky Thoroughbred breeders with a goal, outlined in the original prospectus, to "create a model race track to perpetuate and improve the sport and to provide a course that is intended to serve as a symbol of the fine traditions of Thoroughbred racing."

Today Keeneland is a privately held company with a not-for-profit mission. Earnings are reinvested in the operation in the form of higher purses for horsemen and capital improvements, with a substantial portion used for industry innovations, promotion and charitable contributions.

Keeneland pays taxes, but not dividends, and its directors serve without compensation.

As the world's largest Thoroughbred auction house, Keeneland is the preeminent market for yearlings and breeding stock, conducting three sales annually (September Yearling Sale,

November Breeding Stock Sale and January Horses of All Ages Sale).

Graduates of Keeneland sales include 99 horses that have won 107 Breeders' Cup World Championship races; 21 Kentucky Derby winners; 23 Preakness winners; 19 Belmont winners; 11 recipients of the Eclipse Award as Horse of the Year; and five Epsom Derby winners.

In 2017, Keeneland's gross sales totaled \$538,652,600 for 5,940 horses. The average price per horse was \$90,682.

Each April and October, the world's best Thoroughbred owners, trainers and jockeys converge at Keeneland to compete for some of North America's richest purses. Anchoring the Spring Meet are the Grade 2 Toyota Blue Grass and Grade 1 Central Bank Ashland, prep races for the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks, respectively.

Keeneland's Fall Meet opens with Fall Stars Weekend, featuring nine graded stakes, led by the Grade 1 Shadwell Turf Mile, Darley Alcibiades, Juddmonte Spinster, Claiborne Breeders' Futurity and First Lady. Following the 2015 Fall Meet, Keeneland for the first time hosted the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

General

Location: Six miles west of Lexington on U.S. Highway 60 (Versailles Road), adjacent to Blue Grass Airport.

Visitors: Keeneland is open year-round and welcomes visitors any time. For fans who enjoy watching morning works, horses are training on Keeneland's main track and adjacent training track from 6-10 a.m. (Main track is closed during winter.) Safety around horses is paramount, and Keeneland horses always have the right of way.

Tours: For information about self-guided tours and guided tours, visit Keeneland.com/visitingkeeneland.

Parking: Space for 10,000 cars. General parking free; public preferred parking available.

Total Area of Grounds: 1,034 acres.

Stable Area Capacity: 57 barns, 1,951 stalls.

Main Track: 1 1/16-mile dirt oval, with 4½furlong and seven-furlong chutes. Stretch length, 1,236 feet. Width, 75-80 feet. The Beard Course begins in a chute on the backstretch and measures seven furlongs, 184 feet. It is named for Major Louis A. Beard, a founding

member of Keeneland. The Headley Course is used for 4½-furlong races for 2-year-olds and begins in a chute on the final turn. It is named for Keeneland's first President, Hal Price Headley.

Turf Course: 7½ furlongs. Stretch length: 1,190 feet. Width: 70 feet at finish line; 58 feet at mile pole. Turf course is called the Haggin Course, named for Louis Lee Haggin, Keeneland's President from 1940-1956.

Training Track: Five furlongs, all-weather.

General Admission Grandstand reserved seats: (includes \$5 for general admission) \$10 (Wednesdays-Fridays, Sundays) \$20 (Saturdays) All prices include applicable taxes. Clubhouse: Annual membership. Children 12 and under admitted free of charge.

Sales: Auctions are free and open to the public. Visitors to the Sales Pavilion are invited to watch from the public gallery located just outside the main selling arena. Concessions are available.
