

HEALTH CERTIFICATES AND REGISTRATION PAPERS

HEALTH CERTIFICATES ARE NOW REQUIRED ON ALL HORSES (INCLUDING IN-STATE HORSES). THESE CERTIFICATES MUST BE DATED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF SALE AND TURNED INTO THE KEENELAND SALES OFFICE BEFORE THE HORSE CAN ENTER THE SALE RING.

All horses must be accompanied by a **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** which has been signed and dated within thirty (30) days of arrival by a licensed veterinarian.

Additionally, all horses must be vaccinated against **Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (EHV-1)** by a licensed veterinarian a minimum of fourteen (14) days and no more than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to entry into our stable area. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall indicate the date of the vaccination.

If you have not already forwarded Jockey Club registration papers, Coggins, EVAs or Authorized Agent forms, please do so at once. Consignors who fail to deliver EVA and Coggins certificates by August 1 will be assessed a \$100 late charge per horse.

UNIFORM SALE POLICY FOR MEDICATION AND PROHIBITED PRACTICES

In an effort to protect the health and welfare of the horse, and to facilitate a fair evaluation of the sales horse for the mutual benefit of the purchaser and consignor, Keeneland has adopted a Medication Policy as outlined below, and as set forth in the Sales Catalogue and Conditions of Sale.

Medication

- 1) No more than two (2) non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS) may be administered.
- 2) No more than one (1) cortico-steroid may be administered.
- 3) No bronchodilators, including but not limited to Clenbuterol and Albuterol, may be administered within 72 hours of an under-tack show or sales session in which the horse is entered.
- 4) The following medications may not be administered on Keeneland sales grounds:
 - All substances classified as either Class 1 or Class 2 by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI)
 - Furosemine (Salix or Lasix)
 - Procaine Penicillin

Prohibited Practices

The following are among those prohibited practices as set forth in the Conditions of Sale. Non-compliance can result in Rejection of a sale.

- **Internal blister or other injections to the knee** intended to have the effect of concealing the true conformation of the horse is not permitted at any time.
- **Any invasive practice which intentionally conceals a material defect or chronic lameness.**

NO Anabolic Androgenic Steroids or their esters are to be administered at any time.

Not permitted on the sales grounds:

- **Shock Wave Therapy in any form.**
- **Acupuncture and/or Electro Stimulation with the intent of altering laryngeal function.**
